

## **Results Update Belgrave Primary School December 2016 Including Pupil Progress**

The government produces tables reflecting performance at the end of Key Stage 2 (Year 6) performance in terms of:

- Progress made between the end of Key Stage One and the end of Key Stage Two. This does not include progress made in the first 3 three years to the end of Key Stage One. Performance at Key Stage One is measured by combining teacher assessment and tests taken at the end of Key Stage One in Reading, Writing and Maths four years previously.
- Absolute attainment in tests taken in Reading and Maths and teacher assessment of writing at the end of Key Stage Two.

This information is also included in the school's Results Overview alongside the school's results at the end of Early Years (Reception) and the end of Key Stage One (Year 2).

This document will include a link to the DfE website to enable you to see the data from all schools in England. The Results Overview included information on end of Key Stage results whereas this document includes the pupils' progress calculated from the end of Key Stage One to the end of Key Stage Two (KS2).

The Pupil Progress score is calculated by using a formula which combines the result achieved in Reading, Writing and Maths at the end of Key Stage One where the distinction between the National Curriculum sub levels within Level 2 have not been taken into account. The pupil progress between Key Stage One and Key Stage Two is on a par with the national average.

The schools' attainment scores in KS2 place it in the 14<sup>th</sup> percentile nationally (2948<sup>th</sup> out of 21,225 schools). 69% of pupils met the expected standard in reading, writing and maths. 10% of pupils reached the high level of attainment in reading, writing and maths.

This year the tests were standardised whereby 100 represented the expected standard. The average scaled scores for Belgrave in Reading were 106.7 in comparison to 102.6 nationally. The average scaled score for Belgrave in Maths was 106.4 (103.0 nationally).

The average progress score for Reading was +1.7, for Writing +0.4 and for Maths +1.2.
