COMMUNICATION

A reminder that it is the monthly newsletter which will provide the information, achievements and diary dates for the forthcoming year. This is in addition to Class Dojo and emails that we use to send letters instead of paper copies. Class Dojo is the first form of communication for messages and notifications from staff. Please do not use Class Dojo to message staff as we cannot guarantee that messages will be read. Celebration assemblies will resume on Friday afternoons for one year group per week and you receive a message if your child is sharing their work during that assembly to give you the opportunity to come and join us.

We consider residential visits to be a really important part of the academic year. Visits have been preliminary booked for Years 3 -6 and we ask that you attend the pre-residential meeting (dates / times to follow) so that you


Over the holidays, Eleanor in Year 4 held a book sale of her raised £30 which she has donated to the West Cheshire Foodbank.

HOMEWORK

The homework debate is never much out of the news and school discussions. Should homework be banned? Is homework at primary school a waste of time? Do our children get too much homework? Do they not get enough? There are no current guidelines on how much homework primary school children in England should be set; individual schools should decide what their policy on homework will be and what's set.

Homework can also act as a point of communication between home and school, helping parents feel part of their child's schooling which is something that we do via our Dojo communication in every year group. It is vitally important to have a balance between homework and other activities. At Belgrave, we are focusing on what really matters.

In Early Years and Key Stage 1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) homework is to read on a daily basis (minimum 5 times per week) and Phonics activities. Reading may be enjoying a book together, picking out key sounds or words, talking about the story, finding initial sounds, retelling the story etc. Parents can record this in the Home / School book.

In Key Stage 2 (Years 3-6) homework may include reading on a daily basis, guided reading tasks, spellings and times tables (Times Table Rockstars). Please see individual year group letters (to be posted on Dojo on Friday 9^{th} September) to ensure that you are familiar with the expectations / routines in each class.
