Last weekend, Ivy in Year 1 received her level 1 badge for swimming — a great achievement — well done!



#### **COVID-19 UPDATE ON GUIDANCE 'LIVING WITH COVID'**

From 1st April 2022, the government has changed the rules on accessing tests for COVID-19. As a result of this, they have removed the current guidance for schools and replaced it with the more general guidance below:

As we move into this next phase, schools will continue with measures to reduce the spread of viruses (including COVID). These actions include making sure that busy places are well-ventilated and reinforcing good hygiene practices such as hand-washing and cleaning. We would like to remind you of the key points from the updated government guidance so that you are clear about when your child should and should not attend school:

• It is no longer recommended that children and young people are routinely tested for COVID-19 (unless asked to by a health professional). If they do test positive however, they should not come into school and should try to stay at home for 3 days after the day they took the test. After 3 days, if they are well enough (and do not have an ongoing high temperature), they can return to school.

- Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend school.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people where they can. They can go back to school and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

## MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNING BOARD

We hope you and your children enjoyed a happy Easter and have had a good start to the summer term. Governors will meet this term to discuss ongoing business-as-usual matters relating to the educational and financial management of the school, which officially converted to academy status and joined The Learning Trust on 1st December 2021.

We would also like to invite parents to apply for a parent governor role on the Governing Board in May. The role gives parents the opportunity to contribute to our community by supporting the strategic management of the school from both an educational and operational perspective.

The role of any governor, including a parent governor, is to govern the school in the best interest of the pupils. Governors are elected in order to contribute to the work of the governing board in ensuring high standards of achievement for all children and young people in the school, contributing to strategic discussion and holding senior leaders to account by monitoring school performance and ensuring money is well spent.

Governors are expected to meet twice a term; once for a committee meeting, focusing on either the educational or operational side of the school and then once again for a full Governing Board meeting to discuss school matters. Governors are also encouraged to attend relevant training courses where appropriate and / or necessary. They can also volunteer for specific governor roles on the board, if they wish to.
