It was a sleepy coach ride back to school with pupils exhausted from the day's activities!






YEAR 5 ART PROJECT

PARENT MAIL AND PARENT PAY

The Learning Trust have decided to change the payment method at Belgrave from SchoolMoney to ParentMail to align with the other schools in the Trust.



ParentMail brings all your school information together in one simple, convenient application! Whether you have one child or more at multiple schools, from just one account you can you manage school communications, top up your child's dinner money, and authorise and pay for trips and other items quickly and easily on your smartphone, tablet or computer.

We will inform you about items you need to pay for through ParentMail, and you will be able to pay electronically, using any major credit or debit card and PayPal. You can also pay using cash via your nearest PayPoint retailer. All transactions are secure as all communications with the bank are encrypted, just like purchasing from online retailers.

Registering with ParentMail is very easy. In due course we will send you an email asking you to register.

Please remember that once you have registered, it is important that you keep us updated with your email and mobile numbers so we can make any changes necessary and ensure you do not miss out on important communications.

Two classes in KS2 have met Arfana who shared information about Islam and two classes in KS1 heard a Christian story about kindness and helping others.


