

<u>Covid Outbreak Contingency Plan – September 2021</u>

When should my child selfisolate or miss school?





- From 16th August 2021, children under 18 (or double-vaccinated adults) do not need to self-isolate or miss school if a member of their household or a contact, has Covid.
- Instead, they will need to book a PCR test but can continue coming to school so long as they have no symptoms and the test result is negative.





- If your child develops Covid symptoms at home, they should stay at home and should book a PCR test), NOT a Lateral Flow test.
- If your child develops Covid symptoms at school, they will be sent home and you should book them a PCR test.
- If your child tests positive for Covid, they will need to selfisolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – but instead should book a PCR test.

Community Covid Risk

Description

Actions



Low Community Transmission. No School Cases.

- There have been no cases of Covid within school for 10 school days.
- Cases of Covid locally are low and/ or stable.
- Hospitalisation/ deaths due to Covid nationally are low.

No Covid measures are necessary beyond:

- Reminding children of good hand-hygiene.
- Maintain appropriate cleaning regime.
- Ensuring good ventilation encouraged where practical.
- Ensuring Children / Staff to stay at home if they have Covid Symptoms (and to book a PCR test).

Staff will continue to test themselves twice weekly using Lateral Flow Tests until the end of September. Covid information shared regularly with parents.



Rapidly Rising Community Transmission

- No current Covid cases have been recorded at school, but...
- Cases of Covid are rising rapidly in the community causing disruption to other local schools.
- Cheshire West and Chester Public Health / Public Health

- Ventilation of classrooms increased & hand-washing supervised.
- Staff-room capacity is reduced.
- Whole-school assemblies are replaced with Key Stage assemblies.
- Clinically Extremely Vulnerable staff meet with SLT to review their individual risk assessment & discuss additional protection (e.g. use of face coverings).
- Discuss with CW&C Public Health reverting to staggered lunchtimes.

England issue warnings of expected local/national infection wave.

Number of Cases

Description

Actions



A single child tests Positive

- A single child tests positive for Covid in a class.
- There are fewer than 5 cases in the class.
- No other year groups are affected.
- The child self-isolates for 10 days. Remote learning will be provided if they are well enough to complete it.
- The parents of the child are contacted directly by NHS Track and Trace to establish likely contacts.
- Likely contacts will be contacted by NHS Track & Trace and advised to book at PRC Test.
- Children do not need to miss school or self-isolate whilst they wait for the result of the PCR test unless they have Covid Symptoms.



5 children or staff within a class test positive within 10 days of each other.

- There have been 5 cases of Covid across a class within 10 days which could mean that Covid is spreading within that group of children.
- As above for each positive case.
- The school will discuss the outbreak with CW&C Public Health / Public Health England and agree strengthening protective measures for 10 school days, including:
 - Encouraging the use of face masks in corridors and communal areas
 - Adapting, limiting or postponing relevant extracurricular activities including indoor sporting events, trips and performances.
 - o Reverting to Key Stage Assemblies.
 - Reducing the amount of classes staff work across.
 - Resuming twice-weekly Staff Lateral flow testing if not continuing after the end of September.



Covid cases continue to increase rapidly within a 10 day period.

- Despite the measures indicated above, Covid cases within the school continue to rise within a 10 day period with multiple classes and staff affected, suggesting that Covid is spreading widely throughout the school.
- Meeting held between the school and CW&C Public Health to agree further measures, for a further 10 school days, including:
 - Re-introducing class bubbles.
 - O Reverting to class-based school lunches.
 - Limiting all non-essential visitors to school.
 - Postponing all non-essential events.
 - Re-introducing remote learning for individual classes for 10 school days considered.

The school will inform parents of any changes to Covid measures should these be needed.

We will:

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone.
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes.
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of COVID-19.
- 5. Prefer for volunteers and visitors to be double vaccinated and testing twice weekly SLT available for discussing this school-based expectation.
- 6. Expect staff and families to adhere to government guidance linked to all travel outside UK.
- 7. Communicate any updates or changes with families.
- 8. Liaise with local schools about outbreaks and actions.
- 9. Attend all Public Health briefings and follow the most recent government guidance for primary schools.
