exciting and creative learning happening around school. A wide range of learning across year groups including Polar Regions and Climate Change; Bog Baby adventures and volcanoes


erupting!

YEAR 5 VISIT TO QUEENS PARK HIGH SCHOOL



Year 5 enjoyed a morning of workshops at Queens Park High School last week. They had an informative session about plastic pollution and were given the task to produce a letter to a human in the character of an animal. Hope was a dolphin, Lily was a turtle and Scarlett was in role as a narwhal. They articulated how to express to the human how fragile their lives were and how humans could help.

The class also had a computing session where they used AI to detect rubbish, receiving certificates for their success! Year 5 will be revisiting Queens Park High School again next week to watch the dress rehearsal of their most recent production 'Ghost'.

YEAR 3 TRIP TO LIVERPOOL WORLD MUSEUM

Year 3 had a fantastic trip to Liverpool World Museum last week.

They explored different canopic jars which would have been used to store organs (lung, liver, intestines and stomach) removed from the body in mummification and tried to decide which of the four sons of Horus would have been on the lid to guard the contents (and thought of ways to help remember this). They learned about how archaeologists can explore what is inside a mummy casing without any unwrapping by using modern technology. Incredibly some of the artefacts included materials we use today like Kohl eyeliner worn by all Ancient Egyptians to protect from the sun's glare and because of its antibacterial properties.








WIDER OPPS MUSIC SUPERSTARS


BOOK REVIEW
