Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of Belgrave,





CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

We took part in Children's Mental Health Week in February exploring the theme of **Know Yourself**, **Grow Yourself** in class and in assemblies. We want to equip and empower children, young people, and the adults who surround them to embrace self-awareness and explore what it means to them.

Our younger children looked at the things that made them happy. There were lots of ideas from playing with friends

to eating healthy food and hugs from family! Children listened to a range of calm and relaxing music during activities, practised breathing

techniques and talked about emotions. The children were able to talk about what makes them feel worried, sad or frustrated and what, or who helps them.



Our Key Stage Two pupils have watched mental help videos hosted by BAFTA focusing on 'learning about and understanding yourself and your feelings'. The children have then completed work focusing on helping themselves control their emotions and 'unwind their minds'. Some classes have linked to the character, Riley's personality islands in the film 'Inside Out' thinking about what makes us unique and the different aspects that make up our personalities.




Congratulations to Year 3 who have won the second prize of the series of 10 books featured in **The Reading for**Life author sessions this year.
